

Dear RTFH Family,

In Torah study, we have been studying the long section describing the building of the tabernacle in the wilderness. For a book that is light on description, the Torah dives into deep specifics including the need for "fine twisted linen, of blue, purple, and crimson yards" (Exodus 26:1). Such vivid and varied images reflect on our synagogue too. We are a diverse, vibrant congregation with different interests, but with a joint desire to celebrate the rich tapestry of Judaism and our community.

New initiatives are continuously being developed to reflect who we all are. Meanwhile, the familiar is being reassessed for new generations and needs.

Many people joined us for our meaningful High Holy Days, but so much more happens all year long. In recent months, we had Pizza Under the Hut for Sukkot, unrolled and danced with the Torah on Simchat Torah, and experienced joyous Shabbat Reshon and Shabbat Unplugged – not the services you grew up with. We study Torah every Saturday morning and hold many other educational sessions, including those with our Men's Study and Women's Connection. RTFH hosted the larger Forest Hills community for an interfaith Thanksgiving service and held a special Martin Luther King service. We had spiritual yoga and a Rosh Hashanah meditation service, were visited by Elvis (yours truly) at Chanukah Rocks!, collected and distributed food and clothing to those in need, reached out for pastoral and personal support, smiled, laughed, cried, and built a stronger community.

If you missed some of this, just wait for what's ahead. In the coming months, look for Cantor's Gala benefit concert, *Broadway to Jerusalem*, celebrating Israel's 70th birthday; a day of doing Mitzvot; 21 teens becoming B'nai Mitzvah and 13 adults celebrating an adult B'nai Mitzvah; a "Beastly" Purim; a Pet Blessing; and much more!

FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Religious School. Nearly 150 smiling children come through our doors each week to learn about Judaism and themselves.

We offer:

- Basic Jewish education, including Hebrew, history, liturgy, ethics, and the holidays
- Whole school *Tefilah* (prayer)
- Enrichment through library, computer lab, and music
- Unique, hands-on learning through Project 613, a digital badging system (similar to Boy/Girl Scouts badges) which helps foster Jewish identity and connections between everyday actions and Jewish culture and customs

Temple Tots. Member and non-member families with children under age 5 gather together Shabbat morning once a month to share Jewish songs, prayers, story time, snacks and other fun! Check our website for new session dates and to register.

ToFHY (Temple of Forest Hills Youth) high school program builds our teens' leadership and Jewish knowledge. A youth adviser and a student board work together to create engaging educational, recreational, and religious programming.

DOLLARS AND SENSE

Dues and donations are critical to our ability to provide all the programming that makes RTFH such a warm and welcoming Jewish community.

We recognize that dues represent a significant expense for many of our members, and we try to do everything we can to control our costs, while still funding everything that makes our Temple great. We hope that the following provides a better understanding of what it costs us to do so.


Our total annual costs are about \$1,100,000, or \$4,550 per each of our 242 Member Units. 75% of our budget is the cost of our staff (clergy, administrative, religious school, maintenance). Thankfully, we are able to rent our classroom wing to the NYC Department of Education, which covers a little under 25% of our costs, and we have an endowment of over \$1,000,000 to help cover emergencies (such as building repairs) and annual shortfalls.

As the chart below shows, dues plus religious school fees cover less than 50% of the total costs of operating the Temple. Even after income from rentals and programming, we face an annual shortfall of \$760 per Member Unit. That is why the Kol Nidre appeal and our other fundraising activities are so important to us.

We are excited to have a team currently evaluating both our dues structure and our financial assistance process to better reflect our inclusive and open community and to enable young families to join.
