Voter Registration and the New Ranked-Choice Voting Process

In a 2019 ballot measure, 73.5% of New Yorkers voted "Yes" to Ranked Choice Voting--but what exactly is it, how does it work, and how will it affect the way you vote? ToFHY representatives team up with DemocracyNYC, a division of the Mayor's office, to share information about early age voter registration, the new ranked-choice voting process, what positions are on the ballot this cycle, and ways you can get involved to ensure all eligible New Yorkers are registered to vote.

ToFHY Social Action VP **Sophie Cleary** and ToFHY Ambassadors **Ella Rosenblatt**, **Clayton Frank**, and **Jackson O'Brien** will join **DemocracyNYC** as co-presenters for this informative presentation.

Days for Girls (DfG) has provided sustainable sanitary supplies to more than 1.7 million girls around the world who would otherwise have to miss a week of school and/or work. The DfG Kits include liners, pads, soap, panties, and a washcloth... all expertly packed in a fashionable, hand-sewn drawstring bag. Visit DfG's website daysforgirls.org
